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**Sub:- Providing assistance to the destitutes.**

Sir,

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In inviting reference to this Department Resolution No.EAP-OHFW-RP-19/08(pt)-26168/H, dated 25.11.2008 I am directed to say that the following steps should be taken at your level in connection with treatment of destitute patients on the basis of the recommendation of Hon'ble Odisha Human Rights Commission.

- (1) Open advertisement should be floated in order to empanel credible NGOs with good track record in consultation with the district administration.
- (2) The mandate of the NGOs should be providing total assistance to the destitute patients including taking the blood and other samples for pathological examination, obtaining reports of such examination and any other assistance that the patient may need which would have been provided to him/her by his / her near and dear ones in the hospital.
- (3) These NGOs will provide attendants daily to the hospitals to work in different departments on rotation basis round the clock.
- (4) The critically mentally ill patients may be shifted to the Mental Health Institute at Cuttack after preliminary treatment. However, such other mentally ill patients shall be treated in the psychiatric wards / mental wards and not in other wards and with other normal patients.
- (5) There are many rehabilitation centres in all the districts run by credible NGOs under the administrative control of different departments, these patients may be sent to such rehabilitation centres in consultation with the district administration.
- (6) The number of attendants to be engaged may be decided by the hospital authorities as per their requirement.
- (7) These instructions are to be followed meticulously in addition to the guidelines contained in Health & F.W. Department Resolution dated 25.11.2008.

RESOLUTION

Sub: Guidelines for providing Medical Assistance to the destitutes to prevent death due to starvation.

Starvation is a phenomenon, mainly caused due to extreme poverty and destitution. Government is committed to the dictum that no body should be allowed to die of starvation and in the process, adequate provisions have been made in the Orissa Relief Code and other instructions regarding providing assistance to persons facing starvation.

These two primary causes of starvation namely extreme poverty and destitution may also lead to sickness, which could be fatal, if not remedied timely.

Administration of Medical Care to the persons under chronic destitution, hunger, sickness owing to starvation was engaging the attention of the Government. After careful consideration, Government in Health & Family Welfare Department have devised the following guidelines for treatment of such patients, their transportation to and from the Medical institution and provision of a companion, to supplement the existing provisions under the Orissa Relief Code,

1. Detection of persons having starvation has been entrusted to Grama Panchayat in Rural areas and Ward Councilors in Urban areas. They may take steps to provide urgent Medical Assistance to the sick of those persons including transportation to nearby Medical Center.
2. On detection of such starving sick person, the Village Health and Sanitation Committee shall shift the person to nearby Medical Unit for treatment. In case of destitutes, ASHA or a social activist/ volunteer nominated by ASHA/ Anganwadi Worker may accompany the patient. The transportation of the sick, by Government Ambulance shall be provided free. In case of any other mode of transportation, the transportation cost of the sick, subject to a maximum of Rs 250/- shall be reimbursed.
3. Such person shall be treated in the nearby Medical Center for a maximum period of 10 days. During this period, his medicine and food will be provided free of cost and such cost shall be borne out of any source such as Rogi Kalyan Samiti/ Medicine Bank of Red Cross/ Untied Funds/ NRHM Funds/ User's Fee.
4. The accompanying attendant may be paid @ Rs 50/- per day for a maximum period of 10 days. In case of a destitute having no attendant to stay at the health facility, the Medical Officer may hire the services of a volunteer for Rs 50/- for 24 hours of attendance. The charges towards the accompanying the attendant can also be met from the same source as stated above.
5. The patient after stabilization within maximum period of 10 days in Medical Center can be put to his place through free Government Ambulance service or Government Vehicle. In absence of free transport, transportation cost

subject to maximum of Rs 250/- for the patient and Rs 100/- for attendant can be provided.

6. The patient can be treated only for curable/infectious diseases requiring short treatment, by using funds from the sources stated above. For treatment of longer period, assistance may be sought for from Chief Minister's Relief Fund.

7. Such patients brought by NGO and others in Urban areas shall be dealt by the Medical Officer concerned regarding destitution/starvation of a person shall be final.

8. The Medical Officer of the institution shall be authorized to extend treatment etc. out of funds aforesaid.
